- 1. She said that she was coming. (simple)
- i. She told of her coming.
- ii. She is coming.
- iii. She will come today.
- 2. She treated me respectfully. (adjective)
  - i. She respectfully treats me.
  - ii. She was respectful to me.
  - iii. She treats me with respect.
- 3. How gorgeous is the sunset! (assertive)
  - i. How is the sunset so gorgeous?
- ii. The sunset is gorgeous, isn't it?
- iii. The sunset is very gorgeous.
- 4. No other metal is as expensive as gold. (superlative)
  - i. Isn't gold the most expensive of all metals.
  - ii. Gold is the most expensive of all metals.
  - iii. No other metal except gold is expensive.
- 5. Human is mortal. (negative)
  - i. Not all humans are mortal.
  - ii. Human is immortal.
  - iii. Human is not immortal.
- 6. My ambition is to serve the country.
  - i. My ambition is that I should serve my country.
- ii. To serve my country is my ambition.
- iii. I serve my country is my great ambition.
- 7. Many people want to travel the world. (negative)
  - i. Don't many people want to travel the world?
- ii. Not many people want to travel the world.
- iii. Many people don't want to travel the world.
- 8. That chocolate is not as sweet as this one. (comparative)
- i. The chocolates vary in their sweetness.
- ii. This chocolate is sweeter than that one.
- iii. This chocolate is not sweeter than that one.
- 9. Her looks proclaim her innocence. (complex)
  - i. Her looks proclaim that she is innocent.
  - ii. Her innocence is seen on her looks.
  - iii. She is innocent, her looks proclaim.

- 10. Paul sympathises with the needy and the poor. (noun of 'sympathises')
- i. Paul is sympathetic towards the poor and the needy.
- ii. Paul treats the poor and the needy with sympathy.
- iii. Paul has sympathy for the poor and the needy.
- 11. The examination result gave her pleasure. (verb of 'pleasure')
  - i. Her examination result gave her pleasure.
  - ii. The examination result pleased her.
  - iii. She was pleased to see her examination result.
- 12. A great deal of research has been done on the Science project. (interrogative)
  - i. Has the Science project undergone research?
  - ii. The Science project is thoroughly researched, isn't it?
  - iii. Hasn't much research been done on the Science project?
- 13. We have informed her of her success. (complex)
  - i. She has been informed by us of her success.
  - ii. We have informed her that she has succeeded.
  - iii. We have informed her of her being successful.
- 14. Everyone knows that the earth is round. (compound)
  - i. The earth is round and everyone knows it.
  - ii. The earth is round is a known fact.
  - iii. The earth is round is known to everyone.
- 15. This tea is too hot for me. (remove 'too')
  - i. This tea hot for me.
  - ii. This tea is very hot for me.
  - iii. This tea is so hot that I cannot take it.
