







Once when I was six years old I saw a magnificent picture in a book, called True Stories from Nature, about the ancient forest. It was a picture of a boa constrictor (a type of snake) swallowing an animal. Here is the copy of the drawing.




In the book it said: "Boa Constrictors swallow their whole prey, without chewing it. After that they are not able to move, and they sleep for six months to digest that prey" I then thought deeply over the adventures of the jungle. And after some work with a coloured pencil I made my first drawing. My first drawing looked something like this:



I showed my masterpiece to the grown-ups, and asked them whether the drawing frightened them. But they answered, "Frighten? Why should anyone be frightened by a hat?"

My drawing was not a picture of a hat. It was a picture of a boa constrictor digesting an elephant but since the grown-ups were not able to understand it, I made another drawing; I drew the inside of a boa constrictor, so that the grown-ups could see it clearly. They always need to have things explained. My second drawing looked like this:



The grown-ups' this time, advised me to lay aside my drawings of boa constrictors, whether from the inside or outside, and instead learn geography, history, arithmetic and grammar. That is why, at the age of six, I gave up what might have been a magnificent career as a painter. I had been disheartened by the failure of my drawings. Grown-ups never understand anything by themselves, and it is tiresome for children to be always and forever explaining things to them.
