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Punctuation marks such full stops (.), commas (,), question marks (?), exclamation marks (!) and an apostrophe (') are used in writing to separate sentences and to clarify the meaning.

For Example:- A full stop is used at the end of a sentence. A comma is used to separate words in a list.'

A question mark is used to show that it is a question. An exclamation mark is used after an exclamation. An apostrophe is used to show that something belongs to someone and to write short forms of two words.
