Punctuation marks are signs or symbols which we use in writing to separate sentences and to help us make the meaning clear.



PUNCTUATION MARK



Full Stop



Used at the end of a sentence

Question Mark



Used at the end of an interrogative sentence to form a question.

Comma



Used to denote a pause in a sentence

Exclamation Mark



Used to denote shock, surprise, anger or a raised voice.
