He succeeded his father as assistant organist at St Paul's Cathedral in 1838. He remained in that position for the rest of his life. His students included Canadian organist Romain-Octave Pelletier I, English organists Edmund Chipp, Langdon Colborne, Henry Willis and English conductor Henry Wood.
