## **CONJUNCTIONS**

Conjunctions are words used to join two sentences, words, phrases or clauses. For example: AND, BUT, SO, BECAUSE, OR, etc.

- For addition, we use 'and'
- Example: Rita went to school. Madhu went to school.
   Ans. Rita <u>and</u> Madhu went to school. The two sentences were joined with the conjunction 'and'
- For opposites, we use 'but'
- Example: Tom likes to eat pizza. Sarah likes to eat burger.
   Ans. Tom likes to eat pizza, <u>but</u> Sarah likes to eat burger. The two opposite sentences are joined with the conjunction 'but'
- For choice, we use 'or'
- Example: Jim will wear a blue shirt tonight. Jim will wear a red shirt tonight.
   Ans. Jim will wear a blue or red shirt tonight. Here the sentences showing the two different choices are joined as one sentence with the conjunction 'or'
- For result, we use 'so'
- Example: Ram worked hard. Ram won the game.
   Ans. Ram worked hard, so he won the game. Here the two sentences showing action and result of the action are joined as one with the conjunction 'so'
- For cause, we use 'because'
- Example: I was absent. I was sick.

**Ans.** I was absent <u>because</u> I was sick. Here the two sentences showing the action and reason for the action are joined as one with the conjunction 'because'
