**1 Write short note on the following**

**Manipur**

Manipur lies in the north eastern part of India. Imphal is the capital of Manipur. Loktak is the largest fresh water lake in north east India. Summers are mostly cool, winters are cold. Agriculture is the main occupation of the people of Manipur. Paddy is the chief crop grown in Manipur. Manipur river along with its tributaries Imphal, Iril and Khuga are some of the major rivers that flow through the state.

**2 Mizoram**

Mizoram is located in the north eastern part of India. Aizawl is the capital of Mizoram. The highest peak of Mizoram is called the Blue Mountain. Summers are warm and winters are cool. Three-fourths of Mizoram is under forest cover. Agriculture is the main occupation of the people of Mizoram. The major rivers that flow are Kaladan, Tlawng and Tlau.

**3 Meghalaya**

Meghalaya lies in the north eastern part of India. Shillong is the capital of Meghalaya. It consists of hills and plateaus. Summers are warm and winters are cool and relatively dry. Meghalaya is covered with forests. The main crops grown are rice, millet, corn, potatoes, cotton, ginger, jute and betel nuts. Some important rivers that flow are Ganol, Jinjiram, Someswari and Myntdu.

**4 Tripura**

Tripura lies in the north eastern part of India. It is surrounded by Bangladesh on three sides. Agartala is the capital of Tripura. It consists of mountain ranges and valleys. River Gumti is the main river that flows through this state. Summers are hot and winters cold. Major crop of Tripura is rice.
