1. Most of the states including West Bengal do not have legislative council.
2. After a bill is passed by the assembly it awaits governor's approval.
3. If the legislature is prorogued then a bill shall not lapse.
4. When Legislative assembly is dissolved the bill proposed in the legislative council and not passed in the Assembly will be rejected.
5. If Council does not pass the bill within 3 months of the date of the receipt the State Legislative Assembly may pass the bill without amendments.
6. If a bill is sent to the Council second time and not passed within 1 month of its receipt then the bill stands passed in both the houses.
7. A money bill is introduced in the Legislative assembly.
8. The Council after receiving the money bill must send it back within 14 days with or without recommendations.
9. There should be a gap of 6 months between two sessions in the parliament.
10. The President addresses the joint sittings of both the houses after each general elections.
11. Speaker Protem is a temporary speaker.
12. Motion of Thanks provides opportunity for elaborate discussion of matters referred to in the address.
13. The first hour of sitting of every day of both Houses of Parliament is known as Question Hour.
14. Zero Hour starts at 12 O' clock.
15. In Adjournment motion the matter raised should be of public interest.
