A preposition is a word that shows the relationship of a noun or a pronoun with other words in a sentence.

Prepositions usually come before a noun and it gives information about time, place or direction. The words Besides and Beside are prepositions but with different meaning.

Beside means next to something or someone. For example; Rachel's house is beside the park.  Besides can mean in addition to, apart from and as well as. For example; Besides football, Kapil likes to play tennis.
